Montgomery County, in partnership with ADAMHS and Public Health, will continue to operate a Family Assistance Center (FAC) the week of June 10, 2019. It is located at 1500 Shiloh Springs Road (the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints) with the following hours of operation:

Monday – Saturday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Through an innovative model, the center offers access to one-on-one intervention services to assist with trauma and mental health needs for those individuals affected by the tornadoes. Trained specialists help to identify needs and make referrals to appropriate services.

Additionally, the Center serves as a “one-stop” location for those impacted by the tornadoes. Below are some of the agencies who will be present this week:

On Monday (6/10) and Tuesday (6/11), a free RTA shuttle will run every half hour from 1 to 6 p.m. between the Family Assistance Center, agencies located at the Salem Mall parking lot, and the Salvation Army’s Dayton Kroc Center. At the Dayton Kroc Center people can apply for services, if eligible, from St. Vincent DePaul, Good Neighbor House, and obtain Salvation Army emergency vouchers for clothing and other household goods.

The resource center at the Dayton Kroc Center is located at 1000 N. Keowee St. in Dayton. The hours of operation will be:

Monday, June 10 and Tuesday, June 11 from 1 – 8 p.m.
