

Montgomery County Alcohol, Drug Addiction & Mental Health Services (ADAMHS) pays for many mental health and addiction services. Your treatment team will work to determine services that fit your needs and assist with your recovery.

Not all non-Medicaid service benefits are available to all clients and some services are limited in number of visits, effective July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. Please talk with your treatment team to see if this will affect you.

If you have questions about the services listed in your Individual Service Plan, discuss them with your treatment professional at the provider agency.

Mental Health Services

Montgomery County Alcohol, Drug Addiction & Mental Health Services pays for mental health services provided by many agencies.

Examples of Mental Health Services available:

- Community Psychiatric Support
- Individual & Group Counseling
- Pharmacologic Management
- Assessment
- Vocational

Between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015, if provided by your Individual Service Plan, you are eligible for the following services and hours. Program duration and your specific service plan may affect these amounts.

- 104 hours of community psychiatric support
- 24 hours of pharmacologic management
- 52 hours of counseling
- 2 hours of assessment by physician
- 4 hours of assessment (non-physician)
- 90 days of residential treatment
- 30 days of temporary housing

Alcohol & Drug Addiction Services

Montgomery County Alcohol, Drug Addiction & Mental Health Services pays for services to help persons with drug and alcohol abuse and addiction.

Examples of Alcohol & Drug Services available:

- Case Management
- Counseling, Medical/Somatic
- Urinalysis
- Prevention
- Intervention

Between July 1, 2014 and June, 2015, if included in your Individual Service Plan, you are eligible for the following services and amounts. Program duration and your own service plan may reduce these amounts.

- 90 days of alcohol or drug treatment
- Residential and/or room & board in an alcohol and/or drug treatment agency
